

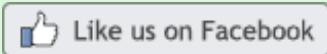

## SBEP to Celebrate Silver Anniversary in 2014



Sarasota Bay was named as an "estuary of national significance" in the Water Quality Act of 1987. After being designated a National Estuary Program in 1989, local, state and federal officials developed the Comprehensive Conservation and Management Plan (CCMP) to serve as a framework for specific actions to restore Sarasota Bay.

SBEP was established as a special district in Florida on July 23, 2004, with the signing of an interlocal agreement. The SBEP partners include Sarasota County, Manatee County, City of Sarasota, City of Bradenton, Town of Longboat Key, Southwest Florida Water Management District, Florida Department of Environmental Protection and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency. SBEP is one of the 28 members of the **Association of National Estuary Programs**. The

Program also works with private contractors and non-profits to complete restoration projects and expand public awareness about the importance of conservation.

**Major accomplishments by SBEP** and its partners include: significant water quality improvement with a 64 percent reduction in nitrogen pollution since 1988, a notable 46 percent increase in seagrass coverage, restoration and enhancement of approximately 1,200 acres of wetland habitat, deployment of 3,000 habitat modules on 9 new artificial reef sites, establishment of the first oyster re-colonization project, development of research protocols for restoring local bay scallop populations, support for more than 40,000 local students receiving environmental education about Sarasota Bay, and the awarding of

more than \$232,000 in grant funding to support 113 local organizations. All of the waterways in Sarasota Bay now meet Florida water quality standards for nutrient pollution.

## Bay Wise Kayak Tours Run Monthly Through April



The SBEP **Bay Wise Kayak Tours Program** for 2013-2014 kicked off in December with two visits to Neal Preserve in Manatee County. The upcoming tours include two visits each month to Leffis and Jewfish Key (January), Lido Mangrove Tunnels (February), Blind Pass (March) and Lyons and Blackburn Bay (April). There are still openings for the free guided kayak tours to Leffis and Jewfish Key on January 4 and January 18.

Brad Tanner leads each of the trips on Sarasota Bay. He's a professional kayak guide, School Program Coordinator for Mote Marine Laboratory and a member of the SBEP **Citizens Advisory Committee (CAC)**. Each outing requires online registration and participants need to provide their own kayak. Many area businesses rent kayaks for the day and some provide expert instruction. The Bay Wise Kayak Tour Program is for experienced kayakers.

The late Jack Taylor, a respected marine biologist and former member of the CAC, launched the Bay Wise Kayak Tour Program in 2007 as part of a SBEP Bay Partners Grant. ## SBEP Bay Partner Grant Applications Due March 3

Applications for SBEP **Bay Partner Grants** are due no later than March 3. The grants promote local environmental education, awareness, community involvement and Bay-friendly stewardship. SBEP has awarded more than \$232,000 in Bay Partner Grants since 2003. All of the projects focus on Bay Restoration, Bay Education or Bay-Friendly Landscaping.

Fully-funded grant recipients for 2013 include Anna Maria Elementary School, Ballard Global Studies Magnet School, New College of Florida, Plymouth Harbor, and Save Our Seabirds. Partially-funded grant recipients include Keep Manatee County Beautiful, Mote Marine Laboratory, Nature's Academy, and Sarasota Audubon Society, Inc. In 2013, the Bay Guardians completed volunteer projects at Jiggs Landing and Perico Preserve in Manatee County and North Water Tower Park and Bay Walk Creek in Sarasota County.

## Bay Guardians to Remove Air Potato Vines and Seeds at Arlington Park in Sarasota on January 25



The first **Bay Guardian** volunteer outing for 2014 is January 25 at Arlington Park in Sarasota. The plan is to remove air potato vines and seeds that can harm native vegetation.
